Counselling and Guidance Sessions:

This is an important educational tool in developing a child from negative ideas often from their peers. Guidance and counselling are indispensable for fostering personal growth, academic achievement, and career development, equipping learners with the skills needed to make well-informed decisions and overcome obstacles.

Medical care:

As part of our primary responsibility, we provided support to cover the medical expenses for our sponsored beneficiaries who fell sick, to facilitate their recovery and allow them to continue their studies. The ongoing rainy season created ideal breeding conditions for mosquitoes, known carriers of malaria, resulting in a high number of malaria cases among several children sponsored by PaCT. Thankfully, with the help of our partner health centre, all 13 beneficiaries (10 males and 3 females) were able to receive effective treatment and have made a full recovery.

Mityana Guardians' Meeting

Before Christmas we marked our final guardians' meeting of the year at PaCT. Our Education team met with parents and caretakers to discuss parenting responsibilities during the holidays and updates from our partner school.





Through these meetings, we tackle challenges, ensure our sponsored children's well-being, and share exciting news on our organisation's upcoming events. We also continue to empower parents to participate in our saving schemes for economic empowerment and financial security

Economic empowerment for PaCT sponsored Children households

To improve the economic prosperity of all PaCT guardians through their respective savings groups, training on Economic Empowerment was recently conducted for various leaders. The comprehensive session focused on expanding knowledge and skills related to savings, income generation, committee member roles and responsibilities, leadership qualities, types of leaders, and sustaining savings groups. Additionally, participants were equipped with the ability to identify potential problems and indicators of group collapse. The training was skillfully led by two facilitators, a social worker from Unbound Uganda, and the PaCT Executive Director Mr. Kinaalwa Geoffrey Ssemakula.

The executive Director emphasized the diverse levels of vulnerability among the guardians and stressed the significance of each individual joining a savingsgroup to enhance their economic standing.



A team of 34 individuals attended the training comprising of 25 females and 9 males. The attendees had different leadership positions from their respective saving groups who included chairpersons, secretaries, treasurers, and members of the Sponsorship Beneficiaries Executive Committee.

School Menstruation Hygiene Management Project.

The project focus is to enhance school attendance rates among girls by promoting Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) and addressing associated challenges, such as the stigma surrounding menstruation.

The project is being actively implemented in three partner schools of Partners for Community Transformation (PaCT). These schools are St. Mugagga Secondary School, Nabukenya Primary School, and Kalangaalo Primary School.

Key Project Components:

- Reusable Sanitary Pads Production Unit: The establishment of a dedicated unit to produce reusable sanitary pads ensures a sustainable and environmentally friendly approach to MHM. These pads can be washed and reused, offering an economical and long-term solution for the girls.
- Girls; Changing Rooms: Acknowledging the significance of privacy, particularly during menstruation, our project involves the creation of purpose-built changing rooms for girls. These rooms are designed not only for safety and privacy but also come equipped with essential water facilities to ensure proper hygiene. The construction of these changing rooms is currently in progress at St. Mugagga Secondary School, complemented by the development of an interactive area aimed at delivering crucial
- Menstruation Hygiene Management (MHM) messages. These combined efforts aim to enhance awareness and comprehension of MHM among both students and teachers, thereby promoting overall hygiene and well-being within the school community.
