Sponsorship Renewal

The children in Mityana, along with their parents/guardians, thank you for your support of their children this academic year. The children have either been given resources whilst schools have been closed or exam year students have been taught at PaCT by qualified teachers.

Primary fees are £180 a year or £15 a month. Secondary fees are £300 a year or £25 a month. If you are setting up a standing order, could you please start it in November, so we have everything in place for the transfer of fees for the start of the academic year. We hope that all sponsors will continue to support their sponsored child/children but if there is a problem, please speak to us as soon as possible so that we can seek a new sponsor for your child. Sadly, if a sponsor ceases to support a child, the child will have to drop out of school as we do not have a pot of excess money to take over their fees. If you are in this situation a solution could be to share the costs between one or more of your friends so that your sponsored child can continue with their education. The families are immensely grateful for all you are doing to help their children and the difference sponsorship makes to the whole family.



International Literacy Day

PaCT joined with UNESCO and other educationfocused institutions to celebrate International Literacy Day under the theme: "Literacy for a human-centred recovery: Narrowing the digital divide".



COVID-19 has disrupted learning for all learners, young and old, at a scale never seen before in history. The need for social distancing and restricted movement among other restrictions had widened the inequalities in access to education and affected 773 million non-literate people holding them captive in illiteracy.



We send our immense gratitude towards our sponsors through Mityana Charity UK who have made it possible for children in Mityana to continue their studies while schools are closed. Over 300 children in both primary and secondary school have received revision study material to keep them active and help them catch up with their counterparts who are having online lessons.

Tough times call for innovation

Prior to COVID-19, 500 million women and girls globally lacked adequate facilities for menstrual hygiene management according to a 2018 World Bank report. COVID-19 disrupted the production, distribution, and accessibility of menstrual health and hygiene supplies affecting an estimated 1.8 billion menstruators across the globe according to UNICEF. Ugandan girls and women who are part of the 1.8 billion were not spared.

As schools are closed and children remain at home, PaCT with support from Mityana UK Charity organised a training for 30 young boys and girls on how to make handmade reusable sanitary pads. With guidance from experts from Gejja Women Foundation, the children set out to sew a pad each.

A set of twins, boy and girl, Emmanuel Muguma and Noeline Nankonge stitched the neatest sanitary pads. "It is hard work, but it is also fun. We sketched and cut the material before sewing it all together to make pads," Noeline explained. "The material was slippery making it hard to sketch on it," Emmanuel added. For carefully producing neat work, Emmanuel and Noeline each received a pack of reusable pads from the trainers. "These are now for my sister," Emmanuel said on receiving the pads.

For better finishing, the hand-stitched pads need stitching with a machine. Teopista Nansereko,

who, with support from PaCT attained a certificate in tailoring also attended the training. "I look forward to making many pads after this. I can use the machine well and help other children to add an over-lock stitch to their pads," Teopista shared as she sewed away at the machine.

This does not stop at training. "We hope to be able to produce reusable pads through our Business Incubation Centre (BIC). Our own sponsored children will make them and the BIC does the finishing. The cost of disposable pads has increased. The money to buy such pads will buy materials to make reusable ones for all the girls



on the programme," Ms Florence Nabukalu the Programme Manager Education and Livelihood explained.

Planning in progress

Our team in Uganda are always looking for ways to improve. Their five year journey through their strategic plan ends this year so they have already started planning for the future.



The many plans which PaCT is developing to extend their work in the community would be enhanced by the completion of the Community Training and Conference Centre.

The need for the centre is twofold:

- It will be used by PaCT for large gatherings such as meetings of sponsored children, and AGMs to save on resources that have been going into them. As well as the many training initiatives that PaCT initiates.
- 2. To generate income locally. PaCT plans to hire out the conference centre for wedding parties, and workshops/training by other charities/NGOs. This would be regarded as a sustainable strategy to reduce dependency on foreign support.
